01 Feilden Clegg Bradley Studios – **Feildbarn Project, Yorkshire Dales**

Revolutionary (and invisible!) rural regeneration: an innovative solution for the re-use of thousands of redundant field barns in the Yorkshire Dales and beyond. A free-standing 'eco-pod' is inserted into a repaired barn, providing holiday accommodation and a source of income to the rural economy. It is built from low-tech materials, generating local employment and training opportunities.
